Notes from the Pastor

MISSIONARY APPEAL: Next weekend our Missionary Appeal will be conducted by Sr. Christine Kosin, OSB, from AIM USA – Alliance for International Monasticism on the weekend of May 17-18. The Alliance for International Monasticism promotes cooperation and solidarity among monasteries throughout the world. AIM responds to the needs of monasteries in the developing world by supporting mission communities in their birth, growth, development, trials, and difficulties.

SPRINKLING WITH HOLY WATER: We will be using a sprinkling rite at the beginning of Mass during the Easter season. The proper response to being blessed with holy water is to make the sign of the cross. When I sprinkled the palms on Palm Sunday, I noticed people doing a variety of things. I was somewhat surprised that many people didn't know what to do when they were sprinkled with holy water. The proper response to being blessed with holy water is to make the sign of the cross. The only time we genuflect is to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle or the monstrance.


<u>CONCLAVE AND THE NEXT POPE</u>: There is a great deal of speculation about who the next Pope will be. I do not have any insight into who it will be, but there is some information that we might want to keep in mind when we talk about the Roman Catholic Church in the world.

If we look at where the Roman Catholic population lives, we will find that 11% are in Asia, 20.8 % in Africa, 20.4% in Europe, 27.4 % in South America, 13.8% in Central America, and only 6.6% in North America. The greatest percentage of Catholics live in the Southern Hemisphere.

There is an increasing awareness that the Roman Catholic Church is certainly quite diverse in its make up of people and that it would seem to make sense for the leader of the Church be someone who represents that diversity. We tend to see the Church as American, because that is our experience of Church. But it is not the reality of the Church in the world.

Our prayers need to be for the Conclave to elect a Pope that will guide us as a Church in the path that God intends and that the Holy Spirit might be the one who leads that process of discernment and selection, as well as guiding us to be faithful followers of the direction the Spirit is leading us.



Any communication asking you to purchase gift cards should be considered a scam. You should always verify such requests by calling the parish directly. Don't use phone numbers in the fraudulent email. Always look for the parish's official phone number found on our website or in our Sunday bulletin. In this age when personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, its clergy, and entities such as parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business information by any method unless initiated by you. Should you receive an unsolicited request for money or personal information – including a request for gift cards of any type - exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or entity being impersonated by using official contact information only. Do not use contact information provided in the potential fraudulent request. Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments- Digital Safety and Your Child: If your child gives out personal information while online, it is easy to track and tough to completely remove. Teach your child to never share personal information such as full name, address, phone number, email, school, or birthday on any social media site. Teach them to never give anyone their passwords. Help your child set up strong passwords and do a yearly checkup on them. Adjust privacy settings for online games, apps, social media sites and your child's electronic devices. Don't forget to check the GPS settings ability to unintentionally share your child's location. Avoid using pubic wi-fi when sharing personal information.
