

Message from the Pastor

<u>SYNOD LISTENING SESSIONS</u>: We will be holding listening sessions on the role of the laity in the Church and all are invited to attend. The listening session at <u>St. Teresa will be on Monday, September 22</u>, in the Parish Center, and at <u>St. Thomas on Wednesday, September 24</u>, at St. Elizabeth Center from 6:30 to 8:00pm.

You may remember these Synod listening sessions started under Pope Francis and are now continuing under Pope Leo. The ideas gathered from these sessions are collected at each parish and then sent to the diocese, then passed on to a national committee, and finally are presented to a committee in Rome. Your input is very important.

Here are the four questions we will be focusing on:

- 1. How does being baptized as a follower of Christ shape the way you live your faith at church and in everyday life?
- 2. In what ways do you feel personally called to share in the Church's mission and help carry it forward?
- 3. Where have you noticed the Holy Spirit moving or guiding you in your life of faith or your connection to the Church?
- 4. What gives you hope when you think about the role of everyday Catholics in the Church and the world—and what would you love to see in the future?





Cemetery Gravestone Cleaning Project

We will be offering gravestone cleaning on a limited scale at ST. THOMAS & ST. ELIZABETH CEMETERIES ONLY. Some members of our cemetery committees are trained in gravestone



cleaning/preservation. The process will help remove dirt, lichen, and lighten up some discolorations/stains on gravestones. It is safe and gentle, so it will not damage the stones. Because each stone is unique, pricing may vary. Rate estimates are: Small stone (24"-35")—\$50; Medium (36"-59")—\$100; and Large (60"-75")— \$150. If you wish to have a loved one's stone cleaned, please contact the parish office. We will be taking orders for those who are interested. Thank you.



Beware of AI Voice Scams

Deepfake technology is getting more convincing every day. Using AI, scammers are now able to clone the faces and voices of friends, family and even the IT personnel who support your computer systems. Use two factor authentication on your financial accounts. When it comes to family members, have a family password. Before giving information or login credentials to computer support personnel, call them separately using contact information you have saved locally before divulging any information or clicking on any links. Remember, scammers rely on urgency to get you to let down your guard. So, trust your gut. When the caller puts pressure on, pause and verify.
