Notes from the Pastor

<u>ALL SOULS SERVICE</u>: On Monday, November 4, at 7:00pm at St. Teresa Church, we will be celebrating Mass in remembrance of all those who have died in the past year from all three churches. A letter went out to families of those who have had a loved one buried from our parish inviting family members to this Mass. All are welcome to attend. Families will have the opportunity to carry up a candle to be lit in remembrance of their loved one. A light reception will follow in the St. Teresa Parish Center.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE: During the month of November, we remember to pray for all those who have died. One way we do that is the Book of Remembrance. You are invited to write the names of your deceased loved ones in this book and it will be placed near the altar during the month of November where we will remember them in our prayer each day. At St. Thomas the book is located near the St. Joseph statue. At St. Teresa the book is located in the back of the church near the stairs to the basement.

SCRIPTURE STUDY CLASS: We are hoping to offer Adult Formation Classes while our young people are attending their classes. I am hoping to offer a class on How to Interpret Scripture beginning Sunday, October 20, from 9:30am to 10:30am in the NEW meeting room in the St. Teresa Parish Center. The class will continue on November 3 and 17, as well as December 15. Please sign up in either church for this class so we know how many to prepare for.

<u>POLITICAL ISSUES TO KEEP IN MIND IN THE COMING MONTH</u>: As a Church and a non-profit organization, we are not permitted to endorse a political party or candidate. That includes those who would use our facilities for a gathering or an event. We encourage people to register to vote and to exercise their right to vote. We can host voter registration events but only if both parties are represented and able to register. We can even hold polling places in our buildings. Political signs are not permitted on Church property as they constitute us supporting one candidate over another, even if that candidate is a parishioner.

Some examples of what can and cannot be done: It is not permissible to rent out a Catholic facility for a dinner for a political party or a candidate for office. Likewise, while it would be permissible to conduct a general voter-registration drive, it would not be permissible to conduct a Democratic or Republican voter-registration drive, since by their nature these would be partisan events.

The Church can host events that explain the Catholic position on issues according to the Catholic Moral tradition and social teaching.

NO GROUP or ORGANIZATION has permission to distribute flyers or other voter education information on Church property. Church parking lots are private property and therefore it is inappropriate for groups or individuals to "leaflet" or distribute materials on cars parked in church parking lots. No one has permission to "leaflet" or distribute materials on cars parked in church parking lots.

The Church must walk a fine line between encouraging people to vote and be educated on issues but can never endorse a particular party or candidate. If a Church crosses this line, it could lose its tax exempt – nonprofit status.

- We will also be combining into one parish envelope system. As a result, your envelope number may change.
- We will also be combining our online giving into one program. Currently we have one program for St. Thomas, WeShare, and one for St. Teresa, Vanco.





Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Is Your Child Street Smart? Being street smart means knowing how to keep yourself safe from strangers when you're alone or with other kids. When you're street smart you know your way around, you know how to handle yourself in tough situations and you can "read" people. Teach your child who are strangers - anyone they do not know or kind of know - and to never approach a stranger's vehicle. Teach your child to always tell you where they are. Teach your child to always go with a friend or two whether walking to school, bike riding or going to the store. Pick out safe spots where your child can go and get help. Places like police stations, stores, restaurants. Teach them how to spot safe places on their route and to avoid places that aren't safe.
