

#### Message from the Pastor

BACK TO SCHOOL: Where did the summer go? As school starts up again for our young people, so also does our Religious Education Program for our young students. Last year was the first year we combined our program and shared time at both churches. It was a great year thanks to our dedicated teachers, our religious education coordinator, parents, and students who made quick friends with each other. Thanks for making the year a wonderful learning experience about our faith and also about what it means to be a parish with two different worship sites. It will be another exciting year particularly for those students who are receiving sacraments.

It might also be a time when we as adults take a moment to update our own faith. What we learned 20, 30 or 50 years ago was great for that time, but we face a different world and often a world that has no time for God, church, or community. This might be a great time to find a way to deepen our faith — through reading, study, or even videos we can watch on our phone or computer. I still recommend Pope Francis' autobiography, HOPE, for its challenging teachings on some of the important issues of our day. One of the sites I continue to recommend for people of any age is <u>bustedhalo.com</u>. This site has new things all the time in short video lessons. Some very good reviews or updates on the sacraments can be found here. And each season of the year, Advent, Lent, Easter, Ordinary time, has a new way to engage ourselves in the season and deepen our relationship with God and with one another.

<u>CREMATION</u>: For many years this was not permitted in the Catholic Church. It was only in 1963 that the Church allowed people to choose cremation <u>with the stipulation</u> that the cremains (what is left after the process of cremation) be buried in the ground or entombed in a mausoleum. Often times people forget the stipulation or the full statement of the rule and just say the church allows cremation. The Church still believes that full body burial is the proper respect to be given to the body after death, since we believe that the body will be reunited with the soul after death in the glory of eternal life. Just as Jesus rose body and soul from the dead, so we believe that the same will happen to us.

Here is another way to state that: Cremation of the body quickly reduces the body to about four to ten pounds of bone fragments. The Church requires that these remains of the body be placed in a respectful vessel and treated in the exact same way that a family would treat a body in a casket.

Since the human body has an eternal destiny in any form, the Church requires that cremated remains of a body be buried or entombed immediately after the Funeral in the same timely manner as a body. Cremated remains of a loved one are not to be scattered, kept at home or divided into other vessels among family members, just as it is clear that these practices would desecrate a body in a casket. The Church allows for burial at sea, providing that the cremated remains of the body are buried in a heavy container and not scattered.




Question for Adults: Today's Gospel is demanding. How do you as a modern man or woman "denounce your possessions?" What does this mean for you?



#### Cemetery Gravestone Cleaning Project

We will be offering gravestone cleaning on a limited scale at ST. THOMAS & ST. ELIZABETH CEMETERIES ONLY. Some members of our cemetery committees are trained in gravestone



cleaning/preservation. The process will help remove dirt, lichen, and lighten up some discolorations/stains on gravestones. It is safe and gentle, so it will not damage the stones. Because each stone is unique, pricing may vary. Rate estimates are: Small stone (24"-35")—\$50; Medium (36"-59")—\$100; and Large (60"-75")— \$150. If you wish to have a loved one's stone cleaned, please contact the parish office. We will be taking orders for those who are interested. Thank you.

#### Devotions— Explained | Lectio Divina

Lectio divina ("divine reading") is a practice of praying through the reading of Scripture, opening oneself to the inspiration and communication of the Holy Spirit.

The practice of *Lectio divina* dates to ancient monastic communities, but it has gained popularity in modern times

as a way to meaningfully engage with the word of God.

The formula for *Lectio divina* is simple and follows four steps. The text of the Scripture is read (lectio) multiple times, and the reader takes note of any words or phrases that resonate with him in a particular way. The reader then reflects deeply on the passage (meditatio) and the words that he noticed, turning them over in his mind. Following this, the reader prays with the passage (oratio), and dialogues with God, inviting him to illuminate the reader's understanding of the text. Finally, there is rest and contemplation (contemplatio).




