



#### Notes from the Pastor

HOLY THURSDAY FOOT WASHING: There are sign up sheets at both churches for people who are willing to have their feet washed on Holy Thursday, which will be at St. Thomas in Corry at 7:00pm on April 17.

DECORATING FOR EASTER: We will be decorating for Easter at the following times: Good Friday (April 18) at St. Teresa after the 7:00pm service (around 8:00pm) and at St. Thomas at 9:00am on Holy Saturday (April 19). We can always use help moving flowers and setting things up.

<u>FISH DINNERS</u>: Our fish dinners are off to a roaring start. Thanks to all those who are volunteering their time to help with these dinners. There are some very hard workers in both parishes. Thanks to all those who are baking desserts – People head to the dessert table first, even before they get their dinner!

• Desserts: A huge part of the success of our dinners is that people get homemade desserts. We are asking the great bakers in our Churches to keep those ovens going and making those great desserts for this year's Fish Dinners. At <u>St. Teresa</u> desserts can be dropped off on Thursday from 4 to 7pm, or Friday any time after Noon. At <u>St. Thomas</u> desserts can be dropped off Thursday from Noon to 3pm or Friday any time after Noon.

• We are always in need of help serving dinners each night. This is a great way for young people to be involved, but is not limited to them, anyone can help.

<u>CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL (CSA)</u>: So far in our Catholic Services Appeal we have 173 pledges for \$85,550 towards our goal of \$62,000. Every registered family should have received a pledge envelope, a flyer and a personal invitation in the mail. If not, there are pledge envelopes in the pews. The CSA is an opportunity for Catholics throughout the diocese to unite in carrying out the work of the Gospel. The CSA reminds us that we are all part of the same Catholic family and that the work of the diocese is the work of the Church.

# CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING: THE SEVEN THEMES OF CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING:

1. Life and Dignity of the Human Person: a person in every stage of life – from conception to natural death – is precious and worthy of protection and respect. Unless human life is treated as sacred and respected, there is no way for a society to be just.

2. Call to Family, Community, and Participation: In a global community driven by excessive individualism, our tradition proclaims that the person is not only sacred but social. The family is the central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all.

3. **Rights and Responsibilities**: Human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. The right to life is the fundamental right but with it comes the right to religion, family, food, shelter, education, a job and health care. These rights also have corresponding responsibilities to family, friends, neighbors, and the larger society.

4. **Options for the Poor and Vulnerable**: The principle of the common good and an authentic response to our Christian vocation requires that the poor must be protected, or society will fragment and all will suffer. Continued  $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow \Rightarrow \Rightarrow$

5. **The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers**: The dignity of work is safeguarded when workers' rights are respected. These rights include having productive work, decent and fair wages, union participation, private property, and economic initiative.

6. **Solidarity**: All people are members of the same human family. The principle of solidarity helps to remind you and everyone else that we are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they live. Loving our neighbor has a global dimension in an independent world. This principle asks all people to work for peace and justice in a world marked by violence and war.

7. **Care for God's Creation**: (**Stewardship**): refers to the proper use of the gifts God has given to humankind, the care of creation that will allow the earth and its resources to flourish and be long lasting.

\*Two others principles in Catholic Social Teaching that we need to keep in mind:

1. **Equal Dignity**: although people have different talents, all have the same fundamental dignity as God's children, made in his image and likeness. Discrimination and prejudice are two barriers to equal dignity.

2. **Subsidiarity**: The idea that individuals or groups that are closer to the problem should be given the first opportunity to solve them without higher levers (e.g., the government) intruding.




#### Rosary Altar Bake Sale Next Weekend at St. Teresa


