

Message from the Pastor

CATHOLIC FOUNDATION GRANT TO ST THOMAS: We had a very pleasant surprise this past week. Our business Manager, Missy Silka, had written for a grant from the Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Erie to help with our senior meals program (Hearts & Hands: Cooking with Compassion). The grant was to help defray the cost of containers for the meals we prepare and deliver to seniors in the amount of \$4700. Lisa Louis, the executive director of the Catholic Foundation, and Bob Crowley, a former president of the board and a current board member, came to morning Mass and then met with Missy, Colleen Zaczkiewicz, and me. They presented us with a letter stating that we were granted the \$4700 we requested and an additional \$5000!!! We were greatly surprised.

There is more to the story that involves many of you who may remember the Capital Campaign the Diocese fostered in 2001. During that campaign the diocese raised money for individual parishes, but also started four endowments: Catholic Education, Priestly Health and Welfare, Faith Formation, and Social Ministry. Many of you who contributed to that Capital Campaign are now seeing your money being returned through this grant and others we have received at both St. Thomas and St. Teresa in the past few years, thanks to Missy Silka's grant writing. Sometimes we wonder where our money goes when we give it to Capital Campaigns. Here is one instance where it has and is bearing fruit for us.

RCIA is now OCIA: You may be familiar with the RCIA program where we help those seeking to become Catholic to learn more about our faith. It is now called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). We are hoping to begin a class for those who are interested in becoming Catholic in October. If you know of someone who is interested in becoming Catholic, please contact the parish office.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE: We will be placing a Book of Remembrance in each of the Churches during the month of October. During the month of October, you can write in the book the names of your deceased loved ones whom you wish us to pray for. The book will be closed on October 31 and placed near the altar for the month of November to remind us to pray for our deceased loved ones.

UPCOMING EVENTS: Keep in mind that our annual **All Souls Service will be held on Monday, November 3**, at 7:00pm at St. Thomas the Apostle Church. All are welcome to attend. We will be remembering in a special way all those who have died in the past year and were buried from St. Thomas or St. Teresa.

The weekend of October 18 & 19 we will be celebrating the feast of St. Teresa of Avila at all the Masses, just as we celebrated the feast of St. Thomas back in July.

Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9:00am at St. Thomas Church in Corry.

Our Advent Penance Service will be Sunday, December 7, at 1:30pm at St. Thomas Church.

Christmas Eve Masses will be at 4:30pm at St. Thomas and at 7:00pm at St. Teresa. **Mass on Christmas Day** will be at 10:00am at St. Thomas Church.

designated by these lines. Those are the only designated parking places. If there are no lines there, it is not a parking space but an area where people are to drive. There are <u>unpaved</u> sections of St. Teresa that are not lined but are used for parking.

There are places that are designated NO PARKING. This means you are not allowed to park there AT ANY TIME. Some of these NO PARKING spaces are FIRE LANES or access to FIRE HYDRANTS. You endanger everyone by not obeying the NO PARKING signs. Other NO PARKING spaces are to allow access to and from the garages, all of them. Other NO PARKING spaces are to provide access to doorways and buildings, particularly in case of emergency. PLEASE have a sense of respect for others and obey the NO PARKING signs. Please do not block entrances and exits to the buildings.

At St. Teresa, there is parking on only one side of 3rd Avenue on Sunday morning. (The side closest to the Church).

Cemetery Gravestone Cleaning Project

We are offering gravestone cleaning on a limited scale at ST. THOMAS & ST. ELIZABETH CEMETERIES Some members of our cemetery committees are trained in gravestone cleaning/



preservation. The process will help remove dirt, lichen, and lighten up some discolorations/stains on gravestones. It is safe and gentle, so it will not damage the stones. Because each stone is unique, pricing may vary. Base rate estimates are: Small stone (24"-35")—\$50; Medium (36"-59")—\$100; and Large (60"-75")— \$150. If you wish to have a loved one's stone cleaned, please contact the parish office. We will be taking orders for those who are interested. Thank you.
