

Notes from the Pastor

<u>CHILD PROTECTION POLICY</u>: There are a number of things we are doing to keep our children safe during Religious Education Classes. One of those things is that only those who have the proper clearances and training are permitted in the building when Religious Education Classes are in session. This sometimes comes as a shock to some people, or a surprise, that they are not permitted in the building while classes are in session. This can be an inconvenience for people, but it is part of our Diocesan Policy to protect our young people.

<u>PARISH REGISTRATION AND SPONSORS CERTIFICATES</u>: It seems every so often we need to remind people about parish registration and sponsor certificates.

Parish Registration: Every baptized Catholic is welcome to be a member of our Parish. Part of being a member is to physically fill out a registration form that gives us contact information for you. This gives you access to information about parish events and enlists you in our parish envelope system to help support the services our parish provides for you. It offers us a means to contact you, or your family, in the case of an emergency.

Being a member of a parish means more than just having your name on the parish roster. Being a member means you attend Mass on a weekly basis, you support the parish with your time, talent, and treasure, you are a part of what happens at the parish in terms of service, worship, and fund raising. Everyone fulfills that responsibility according to their particular situation and means. You might think about it in terms of a sports team. You are considered a member of the team if you go to the practices and the games. You do what the other members of the team do to support the team. If you don't go to the practices or the games, it is really quite a stretch to say you are a member of the team.

Children are considered members under their parents until they are no longer dependents of their parents. At this point, they are asked to register on their own. Those who no longer live here are expected to register in the parish where they live and go to church. Membership is about belonging to the parish where you live and worship.

Sponsor Certificates: This term covers those who are asked to be sponsors for confirmation or those who are asked to be godparents for someone being baptized. This is a special certificate that states


that this person is: 1. A registered member of our parish. 2. Has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist in the Catholic Church. 3. They participate in the celebration of the Eucharist (Mass) on a weekly basis. 4. If they are married, their marriage either took place in the Catholic Church or has been blessed by the Catholic Church.

Some people mistakenly think that a baptismal certificate can be used for a Sponsor Certificate. This is not true. A Sponsor Certificate states much more than simply someone was baptized in the Catholic Church as indicated above. At times people are denied a Sponsor Certificate because they do not fulfill all the requirements to be a sponsor or a godparent. I spend more time explaining this in Baptism class than I do on the actual Sacrament of Baptism because it is often difficult to find people who fulfill all these requirements today. You need to take special care in making decisions about whom you will ask to be a sponsor or a godparent.

INVITATIONS OF WELCOME: This past week members of Parish Council, Finance Council, and the Altar Rosary Societies addressed invitations to people whom we have not seen at the parish in a long time. The reasons why people fall away from the practice of their faith can be many. Recently, COVID was a reason people were away from attending church, and some of them never came back. Parish Council suggested that we try in some way to engage those who have fallen away and try to invite them back.

You may hear from a family member, a neighbor, or a friend that they received one of these invitations. You might help to encourage them to come back to church with your own words and example.

Question for Adults: Name a time when you felt your actions were pleasing to God.








Family Perspective
