

Notes from the Pastor

<u>NEW OFFERTORY STATEMENT</u>: Please note the new offertory summary statement now in the bulletin . This will show what we collected in the offertory, what we budgeted for offertory for the week, and the difference between the two. Remember that the offertory is only one line item in our income (fund raisers, rentals, etc...) and does not cover our total expenses for the week.

THE SOWER OF BLACK FIELD: is a novel by Katherine Koch. It is based on a true story about a Passionist Priest from our Diocese (from Sharon, PA). It is the story of an American Priest in Nazi Germany. It is the story of a local hero. I have provided a copy of the book at each church for people to borrow. I recommend books from time to time. <u>THE SIGN OF THE CROSS</u>: This reflection by Romano Guardini is one that I love to come back to time and time again. The gestures we make have some real meaning. If we make them in reverent ways, they remind us of their power.

When we cross ourselves, let it be with a real sign of the cross. Instead of a small, cramped gesture that gives no notion of its meaning, let us make a large unhurried sign, from forehead to breast, from shoulder to shoulder, consciously feeling how it includes the whole of us, our thoughts, our attitudes, our body and soul, every part of us at once. How it consecrates and sanctifies us.

It does so because it is the Sign of the universe and the sign of our redemption. On the cross Christ redeemed humankind. By the cross he sanctifies each of us to the last shred and fiber of our being.

We make the sign of the cross before we pray to collect and compose ourselves and to fix our minds and hearts and wills upon God. We make it when we finish praying in order that we may hold fast to the gift we have received from God. In temptations we sign ourselves to be strengthened; in dangers, to be protected. The cross is signed upon us in blessings in order that the fullness of God's life may flow into the soul and fructify and sanctify us.


Think of these things when you make the sign of the cross. It is the holiest of all signs. Make a large cross, taking time, thinking

A Stewardship Moment - Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah we get a glimpse of a model for Christian stewards to follow. Within the temple, God's voice shakes the foundations and causes the natural world to shake and tremble. The Lord asks: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah replies to the call of God for service with immediacy and enthusiasm: "Here I am, send me!" There is no hesitation. There are no excuses, contingencies, or "what-ifs." Good stewards know that responding to the Lord's call to serve is never easy, never simple to grasp, never designed for ready comfort and success. But the call needs a response. What about us? What does it take to shake us into an enthusiastic response? To say to God: "Here I am, Lord. Send me!"
