Message from the Pastor

ERIE GIVES – AUGUST 12, 2025: The annual Erie Gives Day will be Tuesday, August 12, 2025. St. Thomas the Apostle Parish and its Mission St. Teresa of Avila Church will be participating, as well as St. Thomas Cemetery, St. Teresa Cemetery, St. Elizabeth Cemetery, St. Thomas Cemetery Endowment Fund and our Religious Education Program. You can access our site at ErieGives.org or on our parish website Parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle and its mission Saint Teresa of Avila Church. One of the great things about this program is that Erie Gives contributes a percentage of their funds to each organization that receives pledges. So, all that you donate, plus a percentage from Erie Gives, goes to each of our organizations which people contribute to through Erie Gives. In addition, Erie Gives is waiving all credit card transaction fees for those who donate. Thank you in advance for your generous support of our parish!

BOOK RECOMMENDATION: "HOPE: The Autobiography" Pope Francis. This book was released shortly before Pope Francis died. I have not finished it yet but it is a profound look at the world in which we live through the eyes and the life of Pope Francis. This book gives us a modern understanding of the Church and where the Gospel of Jesus is found in today's world.

CHRIST'S PRESENCE IN THE EUCHARIST:

We do not begin our celebration of the Eucharist with Christ's absence and then suddenly experience Christ's presence. God is always present to us; it is a matter of us being aware of that presence.

<u>The Eucharist = Christ's real presence + our real presence</u>.

Christ is present in four ways in the Eucharist: In the **Assembly** (people), the **Word of God** in the Scripture readings, the **Bread and Wine** that become the Body and Blood of Christ, and the person of the **Priest**. Let's look at each one over several weeks in order that we might enter more deeply into the prayer that is the Eucharist:

1. First, Christ is present in those who are assembled – the people – THE ASSEMBLY. Jesus tells us, "Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst." When we gather in the name of Jesus, when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus promises us that he is present. Think about the difference between these two types of meals and how it applies to our celebration of the Eucharist. At a Formal Dinner, you encounter people you don't know, and the meal becomes a chore. At an Informal Dinner with friends and family, the meal is fun, inviting, strengthening, renewing. There is some need on our part to make our gathering to celebrate the Eucharist one in which we are more like family and friends.

It also means that we need to participate in this meal. We don't just sit at the table and wait for someone to feed us. We engage with those who are present by greeting them and sharing with them. It will mean that we participate in the responses and in singing the songs and the parts of the Mass that are ours to sing. All the music at Mass is intended for everyone to participate in.

It also means that we prepare ourselves to celebrate the Eucharist. It might mean that we read the readings before we come to church, or while we are waiting for Mass to begin. It might mean that we prepare our hearts and minds to hear God's Word and receive God in the Eucharist under the forms of bread and wine. We might prepare by simply entering into a moment of silence to remember why we are there and the sacrifice that Jesus makes for us on the cross which we celebrate in the Eucharist. When we are

invited to a meal, we usually bring something with us, we prepare something to be shared. We also need to prepare our minds and hearts to celebrate the Eucharist.

Christ is present in us as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist.

2. The second way that we experience Christ's presence in the Eucharist is in the **WORD OF GOD** or the readings at Mass. The readings and the responsorial psalm all come from the Bible. We believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God, not in a literal sense, but in a contextual sense. The story may not contain all the facts or get them exactly right, but the point or meaning of the story is what God intends for us to hear. We do not take the Bible, the Scriptures, to be word for word, or literal, truth. That is a distinction that is not always made clear about how the Catholic Church interprets Scripture compared to how other Churches interpret Scripture.

The readings at Mass typically come from the Old Testament, the New Testament, and one of the Gospels. The first reading is typically from the Old Testament (although in the Easter Season and at various other times it comes from the New Testament). The second reading always comes from the New Testament. And the Gospel reading is from one of the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John. The first reading and the Gospel always have a common theme to them.

"Question of the Week" - 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Question for Children: Jesus tells us to always be ready to hear him. What are some ways that he speaks to us?



All clergy, employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Erie who work with children must undergo criminal record checks. The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children. The second reading typically does not relate to the first reading and the Gospel. The second reading gives us an alternate message to hear or to preach on. The readings at Mass, and at all our Sacraments are taken from the Bible, and only from the Bible. We believe these to be the Word of God in the sense that God speaks a particular message to us through the readings, hence we believe that Christ is present in the readings from Scripture.

One of the best ways to prepare to celebrate the Eucharist is to read the readings before you come to church, so you are ready to "hear" them at Mass. The Scripture references are listed in the bulletin each week for daily Mass and for Sunday Mass. Listening is not always one of our best skills. But each week we are invited to "listen" to God speak to us through the readings from Scripture.
