

### Message from the Pastor

SACRAMENTALS AND SACRAMENTS: Last week I started to talk about sacramentals and the distinction I was making is that sacramentals can be things that lead us to think about God or be signs and symbols that invite us to reflect on what is precious or meaningful in our lives, but they are not sacraments. Sacraments, the seven sacraments of our church, are not mere signs and symbols, but they are real experiences of God's presence. The signs and symbols we use can help us to experience this real presence of God. This week I would like to reflect on Jesus as a sacrament and the Church as a sacrament.

People experienced Jesus in a variety of different ways. Some saw him as a teacher or a prophet; others saw him as a troublemaker and a blasphemer. Some saw him as the messiah and others saw him as a danger to the Jewish people and had him arrested and killed.

Other people saw Jesus as more than a human being. They felt as if God were speaking to them through Jesus. His curing of the sick led others to see the power of God at work in him. His loving and generous spirit led others to be more loving and generous in their lives. The disciples ask Jesus to show them the Father and Jesus told them that whoever has seen me has seen the Father.

Jesus was for these people a sign of God's presence, a sacrament of God's presence, love, concern, and power to heal. They experienced in the person of Jesus what we experience in the sacraments.

Jesus continues to be a sacrament for us today. Even though Jesus is no longer with us in person, his image in the gospels, liturgies, hymns, and art, continue to make God's presence real to us even to this very day. Jesus reveals to us so much of what we know and understand about God.

After Jesus lived, died, rose from the dead and ascended into heaven he was no longer present to his disciples as he had been during his lifetime. How would the disciples keep his presence alive now that he was gone? Jesus promised that he would be with his disciples even to the end of the world and he promised to send the Holy Spirit to empower the disciples. This new way of being present to his disciples enabled them to continue the work of Jesus and to keep his presence alive in the world.

St. Paul describes this new way of being present to us in his letter to the Ephesians. Paul speaks about how the church (the community of believers), was the Body of Christ – Christ present in the world. The disciples and the faithful people continued to do the things that Jesus did as they were filled with Holy Spirit. They told the stories of Jesus and shared his teachings, they formed community, cured the sick, and cared for the poor. The Holy Spirit now enabled the disciples to do what Jesus did. This community of believers, through the power of the Holy Spirit, had now become the Body of Christ, the presence of Christ in the world.

Through the centuries various religious orders (Franciscans, Benedictines, Jesuits, Dominicans...) and various individuals (Francis of Assisi, Vincent de Paul, Damien of Molokai, Mother Teresa, Carlo Acuti ....) ministered to the poor, the sick and the dying. Their lives were sacramental because people saw the love of God shining through them.

The work of Jesus is being carried out by lay people, religious orders, priests and deacons in the way they have devoted their lives to serving others. Whether they work in parishes, diocesan offices, or social work, in this country or as missionaries, and whether they

work full time or part time, or as volunteers, these people are filled with the Holy Spirit and work to bring the presence of Christ to the world.

The work of Jesus also continues in families by the love that is shown in the home and in how faith is passed on from generation to generation. It continues in the ways neighbors care for

each other and for the strangers in their midst. People see the very presence of God living and active in their lives.

The Second Vatican Council spoke about this notion of the Church as Sacrament when it proclaimed that the presence of Christ was real and active in the work the Church was doing in how it proclaimed the message of Jesus and cares for people as he did. When it stands up for moral issues in the world. Those people who make up the Church make visible the presence of Christ.

(Next week we will see how this Church as Sacrament also has seven moments when we believe this presence of Christ is experienced in a ritual and living way.)

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### Knights of Columbus Food Drive Collection


The Knights of Columbus, Council #425 is holding a food drive to benefit the Corry Food Pantry from now until the week prior to


