Message from the Pastor

<u>ADVENT REFLECTION SERIES BY DOLORES SMYTH</u>: A few years ago I came across an article by Dolores Smyth about finding balance in our lives. As we begin another Advent and Christmas Season, things get very busy and sometimes we lose our focus. Hopefully, these reflections from her article can be of help to us all.

3. Nurture the ties that bind to feel happier, live longer

The Gospels tell us that Jesus' first miracle was performed at a wedding he attended with his mother (John 2:1-11). It's telling that Jesus chose to commence his ministry while surrounded by friends and family. It's also telling that, upon embarking on his ministry, Jesus selected a steady group of supporters with whom to travel and carry out his work.

Numerous studies have shown that people in supportive relationships are happier, have fewer health problems, and live longer than those without such social bonds.

To seize opportunities for quality time with others, I turned outings alone into time spent with loved ones. I discovered that time together didn't have to be fastidiously planned or the destination especially noteworthy. In fact, some of my most enjoyable get-togethers have been in the midst of running errands. I'm lucky to have loved ones nearby, but if that isn't the case for you, join a club or take up a hobby that might introduce you to likeminded people with whom to enjoy your time.

YOUR GENEROSITY IS APPRECIATED: We have been involved in a number of community projects in recent weeks and I want to thank everyone who helped to make these projects so successful. First, I want to thank all those who have been reaching out and donating to help the Wilson family after the loss of their home due to a fire. The support has come in a variety of ways: the GoFundMe page that people have supported, we collected \$6,175 from parishioners so far, and our Religious Education Program provided all the fixings for a Thanksgiving meal. Your response has been incredible. And I know Heather and her family are overwhelmed by the generous response of people. We can all help them rebuild their home and their lives by contributing to a GOFUNDME page at GoFundMe.com and search for "posie hill." If you are not able to use the GoFundMe page, you can place your donation in an envelope marked "Wilson Family" and place it in the collection basket. We will then forward the money on to the family with a check from the church. Thank you.

We have also been involved in the collection of food at both Churches — at St. Thomas the Knights of Columbus have been collecting food for the Food Pantry in Corry and at St. Teresa parishioners and Religious Education students collected food to feed 30 families at Thanksgiving. Even the 30 turkeys were donated by a generous parishioner. And in recent days we have been receiving presents that you purchased to help needy children at Christmas. I just want to extend my heartfelt thanks for your generosity to these various causes and the good things you are doing to help those in need in our parish and our community.


Knights Sponsoring Sacred Heart Holy Hours this Week

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Bullying is defined as any unwanted aggressive behavior by another youth or group of youths that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of youth ages 12-18 experience bullying. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that bullying is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents can educate themselves on the signs that a child is being bullied or is a bully. Parents should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. In response to requests for clarification, the Diocese of Erie wishes to remind the faithful of the status of **Dilworth "Skip" Davis.** He was ordained a Catholic priest in 1998 but abandoned active ministry without permission on September 27, 2021.

Dilworth "Skip" Davis is not a priest in good standing in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie. He has no ministerial responsibilities at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish, Corry, or any Catholic church in the Diocese of Erie.

Although he continues to identify himself as "Fr. Skip", he does not act on behalf of the Catholic Church and is not permitted to officiate at any sacraments or ceremonies according to Catholic rites including funerals, baptisms or weddings. He does not have the faculty to validly absolve in confession except for in danger of death, nor does he have the right to distribute Holy Communion publicly or privately.

In addition, he has no authority to raise funds for Catholic ministries. Any attempts to raise funds for his initiatives have no relationship to legitimate ministries of the Catholic Church or the Diocese of Erie.

Anyone with questions or concerns about religious services performed by Dilworth "Skip" Davis since September 2021 is encouraged to speak with their local pastor.


