

Message from the Pastor

<u>ADVENT REFLECTION SERIES BY DOLORES SMYTH</u>: A few years ago I came across an article by Dolores Smyth about finding balance in our lives. As we begin another Advent and Christmas Season, things get very busy and sometimes we lose our focus. Hopefully, these reflections from her article can be of help to us all.

4. <u>Deepen your discussions with God to make better, more</u> confident choices

The Gospels cite several instances in which Jesus prayed, whether alone (Luke 5:15-16) or with others (Luke 9:28). Even during his anguish at the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus turned to prayer to grapple with his fears and embolden himself for what was to come (Matthew 26:36-42).

Whenever I find myself thinking that I don't have time to pray, I remind myself that there's no context within which I can't take a moment to pray silently. By stealing minutes to sit in God's presence and discuss my tribulations, I've deepened my faith life in leaps and bounds. This spiritual balance has helped me make better choices for myself, which in turn makes me better at helping others.

Finding balance takes prioritizing; maintaining balance takes determination. By putting Jesus' balance-seeking lessons into practice in my life, I feel healthier, revitalized, and more connected than ever to my loved ones and to my faith. Even on turbulent days when there don't seem to be enough hours to do what I must, I find that if I stick to these balance-seeking techniques, I have more focus and energy to get things done, making the best use of the time I do have.

YOUR GENEROSITY IS APPRECIATED: We have been involved in a number of community projects in recent weeks and I want to thank everyone who helped to make these projects so successful. First, I want to thank all those who have been reaching out and donating to help the Wilson family after the loss of their home due to a fire. The support has come in a variety of ways: the GoFundMe page that people have supported, we collected \$6,175 from parishioners so far, and our Religious Education Program provided all the fixings for a Thanksgiving meal. Your response has been incredible. And I know Heather and her family are overwhelmed by the generous response of people. We will continue to collect donations at the parish. You can place your donation in an envelope marked "Wilson Family" and place it in the collection basket. We will then forward the money on to the family with a check from the church. Thank you.

We have also been involved in the collection of food at both Churches – at St. Thomas the Knights of Columbus collected food for the Corry Food Pantry and at St. Teresa parishioners and Religious Education students collected food to feed 30 families at Thanksgiving. Even the 30 turkeys were donated by a generous parishioner. And in recent days we have been receiving presents that you purchased to help needy children at Christmas. I just want to extend my heartfelt thanks for your generosity to these various causes and the good things you are doing to help those in need in our parish and our community.

A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE from Fr. Tom

On behalf of the parish staff, I would like to wish you and your family a very Blessed and Joyful Christmas Season. Our prayer is that the peace the Christ child brings will be the peace that dwells with you each and every day of the New Year.

Often when we think of the meaning of Christmas we tend to think of it in terms of God sending Jesus to die for our sins. That Jesus came to be the "ransom" for our sins and failings. In some sense that is certainly true, but I believe there is a deeper significance to the Incarnation, or the birth of Jesus.

The real purpose of creation is for the Incarnation to happen. God wants to share in the life and love of his people in a unique and definitive way. God becoming human is not an afterthought, an event to make up for our sinfulness. Incarnation is God's first thought, the original design of creation. Jesus becomes flesh in order to fulfill God's eternal longing to become human, to be one with us.

This gives us a wonderful image of God, a gracious God, sharing divine life and love with us. Like parents sharing their love in the life of a new child. God wants to be so much a part of our lives that he is willing to enter into every moment of our human existence, from birth to adolescence, from joy to sorrow, and even from life to death. God wants us to know that he is Emmanuel, "God with us," because he is indeed with us in every moment of our lives.

Maybe the words of the great thinker, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, say it best: "No, God does not hide himself to make us search for him, of that I am sure, much less to let us suffer in order to increase our merits. On the contrary, bent down over his creation which moves upward to him, he works with all his power to give us happiness and light. Like a mother he watches over his newly born child. But our eyes are unable to see him yet. Is not precisely the whole course of centuries needed in order for our gaze to accustom itself to the light?"

of our loving God. May the light from his eyes be your guide in moments of darkness. May the warmth of his breath increase the warmth of your heart.
