





Notes from the Pastor

FISH DINNERS: Lent starts early this year, February 14! And with Lent, comes our fish dinners at both parishes. These are an enormous undertaking and can always use more volunteers. If you are able to help with cooking or serving, please contact Sue Vinca or Judy Green at St. Thomas or Becky Boleratz at St. Teresa.

We are making a special plea this year for help with cleaning up after the dinners are over. This will entail moving tables and chairs, sweeping and mopping floors. Those who cook and serve the dinners have usually put in a full day by the time the dinner is over. We are hoping to build a crew of workers who will come in after dinner and be in charge of cleaning up. If you, or your group, are willing to help us with this task, please contact the parish office or Fr. Tom.

GENUFLECTING AND KNEELING: I have noticed a few people who struggle to kneel or genuflect in church. As we get older some of those joints do not function as well as they used to. Know that it is perfectly acceptable to offer a bow instead of a genuflection, or to sit if it is difficult to kneel.

FASTING BEFORE COMMUNION: People have been asking me if the rules about fasting before communion have changed. The simple answer is, "No, they have not changed." The more complicated answer deals with what the rule says. There were older rules about having to fast from Midnight onward before receiving communion. That was relaxed many years ago to simply be that we are asked to fast for one hour before receiving communion from food or drink. The exceptions to the rule are water and medicine. There is also an exception for those who may be ill at home or in the hospital. The rule of fasting does not apply to them.


Pot Luck Dinner at St. Thomas





Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month: Child Sex Trafficking is a form of child abuse that occurs when any child under age 18 is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is traded for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be anyone including friends, gangs, family members, foster parents, perceived trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk to your child openly about this reality and build resiliency. Address the myths and misconceptions that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Social media and gaming platforms are increasingly becoming the tool traffickers and other predators use to target, groom, and recruit victims. At some point your child will likely be confronted with inappropriate messages or see things online that they know are wrong. Teach your child how to handle these situations.
