

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT APRIL 6, 2025

Notes from the Pastor

PALM SUNDAY AND HOLY WEEK: We might remember there are two parts to our liturgy next weekend: **1.** Blessing of Palms and carrying them in procession as the people did as Jesus entered into Jerusalem to begin his Passion. **2.** The reading of the Passion—we participate as the crowd in the drama of the Passion even to the point of shouting "Crucify Him!" We are invited to PARTICIPATE in the dramatic events of this Holy Week. The church invites us to enter fully into the events of this week: having our feet washed on Thursday, Venerating the Cross on Good Friday, renewing our baptismal promises, and blessing ourselves with the new Easter water. As the church invites you to participate in this Holy Week, so too do we invite you to participate.

HOLY THURSDAY FOOT WASHING: There are sign up sheets at both churches for people who are willing to have their feet washed on Holy Thursday, which will be at St. Thomas in Corry at 7:00pm on April 17.

<u>DECORATING FOR EASTER</u>: We will be decorating for Easter at the following times: Good Friday (April 18) at St. Teresa after the 7:00pm service (around 8:00pm) and at St. Thomas at 9:00am on Holy Saturday (April 19). We can always use help moving flowers and setting things up.

<u>SOCIAL JUSTICE</u>: The Human Person is central to everything we believe. The Social Teaching of the Church is rooted in this notion of the human person and how we view the human person. Our "social" teaching cannot be social without people.

Our understanding of the human person is rooted in the belief that every human person has immense dignity which comes from the fact that each of us is a unique creation of God. There are no two people who are exactly alike and the differences in each person are part of the uniqueness and value of each person.

In order to have this dignity, one must have life. This right to life that all human beings have is the basis of our dignity. This right to life is one that we value from the beginning of life (conception) to natural death. Our understanding of the dignity of each human person affects the way we view issues of abortion, contraception, and genetic engineering. But it also affects how we treat life in all its stages from conception, to life, to illness, to death. How we nurture and respect life in all its stages is part of how we view the dignity of human life. How we treat people who are ill is one of the many medical ethics questions that are raised when we talk about the right to life. What kinds of treatments and procedures are considered ordinary and what are considered extraordinary? These types of distinctions are crucial for how we view life and how we treat life. There are issues about how we care for life, not just at the beginning of life, but also at the end of life. Issues that deal with what types of care are ordinary or extraordinary, euthanasia, compassionate care for the sick and dying, self-defense, capital punishment. There are also issues about violence, war, poverty and others that affect life in other ways. All these issues revolve around our belief in the dignity and value of human life and the human person.


"Question of the Week" - Fifth Sunday of Lent

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Child Abuse Prevention Month—Reporting Child Abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2023 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 5,129 substantiated reports of child abuse. 1,749 or 34.1% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,350 were physical abuse. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. To report child abuse, call Childline at 1-800-932-0313 (anytime 24/7). For particular questions on reporting abuse in the Diocese of Erie, you may call the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth at 814-824-1195.
