#### Message from the Pastor

<u>ADVENT REFLECTION SERIES BY DOLORES SMYTH</u>: A few years ago I can across an article by Dolores Smyth about finding balance in our lives. As we begin another Advent and Christmas Season, things get very busy and sometimes we lose our focus. Hopefully, these reflections from her article can be of help to us all.

#### 2. Eat well to boost your health and energy

While ministering to the multitudes, Jesus understood that he and his disciples needed a proper meal as much as they needed sufficient rest (Mark 6:30-31). In fact, making time for meals was of such significance to Jesus that he revealed the Kingdom of God while breaking bread with his disciples (Luke 22:14-20).

I knew that making time for well-balanced meals was crucial to ward off certain types of diseases, maintain a healthy weight, and keep energy levels high. To put this into practice, I started cooking nutritious, vegetable-rich recipes, and buying good-for-you snacks like Greek yogurt, string cheese, fruit, and nuts that I now grab onthe-go instead of skipping meals. Making better food choices has helped me feel better-nourished, more proactive about my health, and more energized to tackle my daily tasks.

YOUR GENEROSITY IS APPRECIATED: We have been involved in a number of community projects in recent weeks and I want to thank everyone who helped to make these projects so successful. First, I want to thank all those who have been reaching out and donating to help the Wilson family after the loss of their home due to a fire. The support has come in a variety of ways: the GoFundMe page that people have supported, we collected \$6,175 from parishioners so far, and our Religious Education Program provided all the fixings for a Thanksgiving meal. Your response has been incredible. And I know Heather and her family are overwhelmed by the generous response of people. We can all help them rebuild their home and their lives by contributing to a GOFUNDME page at GoFundMe.com and search for "posie hill." If you are not able to use the GoFundMe page, you can place your donation in an envelope marked "Wilson Family" and place it in the collection basket. We will then forward the money on to the family with a check from the church. Thank you.

We have also been involved in the collection of food at both Churches — at St. Thomas the Knights of Columbus have been collecting food for the Food Pantry in Corry and at St. Teresa parishioners and Religious Education students collected food to feed 30 families at Thanksgiving. Even the 30 turkeys were donated by a generous parishioner. And in recent days we have been receiving presents that you purchased to help needy children at Christmas. I just want to extend my heartfelt thanks for your generosity to these various causes and the good things you are doing to help those in need in our parish and our community.


#### St. Thomas Church Choir
