

Notes from the Pastor

<u>FISH DINNERS</u>: We are gearing up for Fish Dinners at both Churches and that means we could always use your help.

• Desserts: A huge part of the success of our dinners is that people get homemade desserts. We are asking the great bakers in our Churches to start thinking about and getting ready for making desserts for this year's Fish Dinners. At <u>St. Teresa</u> desserts can be dropped off on Thursday from 4 to 7pm, or Friday anytime after Noon. At <u>St. Thomas</u> desserts can be dropped off Thursday from 12 to 3pm or Friday anytime after Noon.

• We are always in need of help serving dinners each night. This is a great way for young people to be involved, but is not limited to them, anyone can help.

<u>UPCOMING EVENTS</u>: As Lent is rapidly approaching, here are some dates to keep in mind.

• Ash Wednesday is March 5. We will have Masses at St. Thomas at 8:00am and at St. Teresa at 7:00pm with ashes being distributed. There will also be a Liturgy of the Word service with the distribution of ashes at BOTH churches at Noon.

• **Stations of the Cross** will be prayed on Thursdays of Lent at St. Teresa at 7:00pm and on Fridays of Lent at St. Thomas at 7:30pm.

• **Penance Service** will be at St. Thomas on Sunday, March 23, at 1:30pm. There will be several priests there to hear confessions as a part of the service.

<u>CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING</u>: Last week I began this reflection on Social Justice by looking at how we understand the human person. We are made in the image and likeness of God, and our ultimate happiness is found in living our lives being true to our original goodness. The example of Jesus provides us with an example we can follow in order to find our true happiness.

This week allow me to reflect on the social nature we have as human beings. We believe that each person is individually unique, there is no other person exactly like us. But there is something that we all have in common as human beings – we are social beings. Not social in the sense of outgoing, but social in the sense of how we are called to *be with others*. At our very beginning we are born into a family, and that family is the beginning of our connection with other people.

We understand this social nature in terms of the society we live in and the society of all human beings. Every group we belong to is an expression of this in terms of the unity we form by being a part

of that group. It begins with family and expands to school, city, state, nation, world. Our shared humanity in these groups helps to form who we are through belonging, mutual service and dialogue. We might see our social nature as rooted in our being made in the image and likeness of God, a God who is a trinity of persons. God is social within God's very self – three persons in one God. In the same way we are called to be united with other people as individuals sharing a common humanity. One of the documents of Vatican II, Gaudium et Spes 24, states that we can fully discover our true self only in a sincere giving of ourselves. It is only in being true to our social nature that we will come to find our true happiness of being one with God and with each other.

We can also see our church community, our parish, as the people of God. In our church community we form a unity with God and one another through our worship and the practice of our faith. But our unity does not end there. We are always called to bring the message of God's love and mercy not only to each other, but to all people in the human family of God, the mystical Body of Christ.

And so, as people made in the image and likeness of God, we are called to not only pursue our happiness on our own, but in relationship with one another. This gives us the basis of our Catholic Social teaching. We will look next at how this calls us to work for justice.

Lent 2025 Schedule for St. Thomas the Apostle and its mission, St. Teresa of Avila

Ash Wednesday * <u>ASH WEDNESDAY</u>: Wednesday, March 5, is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of Lent. Masses with the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 8:00AM at St. Thomas and 7:00PM at St. Teresa. There will also be a prayer service at Noon with the distribution of ashes at both Churches.

PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING: and other forms of self-denial are encouraged during Lent. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.

ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, AND GOOD FRIDAY: are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

<u>ALL FRIDAYS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR</u>: outside of Lent **remain days of penance**. Each Friday is an opportunity for us to reflect on the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross made on Good Friday. As part of our gratitude for what God has done for us some act of penance should accompany each Friday of the year. <u>The traditional practice of abstinence from</u> <u>meat, together with fasting, for the cause of peace in the world is highly recommended.</u> <u>However, some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance may be</u> <u>substituted.</u>

<u>ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY</u>: are DAYS OF FASTING for those age <u>18 to 58</u> <u>inclusive</u>. (Those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal and two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are permitted. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: During the Lenten Season we will celebrate the Stations of the Cross on Thursday evening at 7:00PM at St. Teresa and on Friday evenings at 7:30PM at St. Thomas.

LENTEN PENANCE SERVICE: Sunday, March 23 at 1:30PM at St. Thomas Church in Corry. Several priests will be available to hear individual confessions.
