Notes from the Pastor

ERIE GIVES AUGUST 13, 2024 – MIDNIGHT TO MIDNIGHT: St. Thomas and St. Teresa Parishes are again participating in Erie Gives. Our Parish Cemeteries of St. Elizabeth, St. Teresa and St. Thomas are also participating. This is a great way to give to our Parishes and Cemeteries and receive extra monies through the Bonus through the Erie Gives Bonus Bucks Pool that gives a certain percentage to each gift. Your online donations can be made at https://www.eriegives.org/

In previous years, the Erie Gives Bonus Bucks Pool was promoted as the Prorated Match Pool. Thanks to generous corporate partners and a commitment of the Foundation's Board of Trustees, we have a Bonus Bucks Pool, which is an extra incentive for donors to give. On Erie Gives, donors make gifts to their favorite nonprofits via checks, online donations, stock gifts, or a required minimum distribution from an IRA. A portion of the Erie Gives Bonus Bucks - the pooled corporate sponsorship dollars - is added to each gift. For example, last year, each gift received an extra 5.5% from the \$455K+ match pool.

OUR LADY OF FATIMA CHURCH: Now that we are no longer having Mass at Our Lady of Fatima Church at Canadohta Lake, people are wondering what will happen to the property. Sometimes when a Church is no longer being used for worship, the pastor and parish council can petition the Bishop to "deconsecrate" the church or the more proper terminology in Canon (Church) Law is to relegate the church to profane but not sordid use. Basically, this means that the Bishop in effect deconsecrates the church and allows the building to be used for some other purpose, but not for something sordid.

How does that process work? The pastor meets with both Parish Council and Finance Council and discusses the situation surrounding the Church building that is no longer in use. The discussion may include how the parish that once used the Church building has decreased or is unable to sustain the parish, or that it has been merged or consolidated for whatever reason. The discussion would include how the pastor and the parish that is responsible for this Church building might care for the souls of those who now have moved to a new Church building. At the end of this discussion, there may be a motion for the pastor to petition the Bishop to relegate the Church to profane but not sordid use. A vote would be taken on this motion at both Parish and Finance Council.

If both Councils vote to have the pastor petition the Bishop, then the pastor works to compose a letter making this request to relegate the Church to profane but not sordid use. The pastor will supply documentation and reasons for this request based on the discussions with Parish and Finance Councils and the financial situation of the Parish.

The Bishop will then consult with the Presbyteral Council of the Diocese and seek their advice on this situation. If the Bishop then decides to grant the request of the pastor and the parish, then the property can be put on the market for sale. The deed will include what is called a "covenant" stating that the property can be used for profane but not sordid use. All those who purchase the property will be required to follow that "covenant."

The property will be put on the market by a realtor and those interested in purchasing the property will be able to make a bid according to the normal rules governing all realty transactions.

Seeking Volunteers to Help Sell Tickets at the Sparty Fair





Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

On the weekend of August 17-18 our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has given Catholics in the United States

an opportunity to share faith in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout Latin America and the Caribbean islands. The Catholic Church in Latin America is currently facing barriers to practicing its faith. Shortages of resources and pastoral workers, as well as poor infrastructure, make simple things like attending weekly Mass difficult for many.

The work of evangelization is carried out by Christians who meet people where they are—not only in a geographical sense but also in the context of culture. The countries of South America have diverse populations from Indigenous, African, European, and Asian ancestries, all with different cultural experiences. By welcoming and understanding people from so many backgrounds, the Church grows and continues its mission of making disciples of all peoples.

This collection, scheduled for the weekend of August 17-18, is an essential resource for dioceses – such as our Sister Archdiocese of Yucatán in Mexico – parishes, religious congregations, seminaries, and other Catholic institutions in Latin America. Please give generously to this collection. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish's online giving platform. Evangelization programs are made possible in Central and South America in part through the generosity of the people of our diocese to the Collection for the Church in Latin America.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Diocesan Requirements for working with children: Working alongside the Bishop, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth reinforces the ongoing implementation of policies and procedures that protect children. All clergy, employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Erie who work with children must undergo criminal record checks. The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children. New Look to Our Religious Education Program

Our Religious Education Program will combine this coming year. The number of students does not merit having two separate programs.



Combining our resources will help to make our program stronger. This Fall for the 2024-2025 Religious Education Year, we will have classes at St. Teresa for the first half of the year (September—December) and at St. Thomas for the second half of the year (January—May).

<u>UPCOMING CHANGES</u>: Now that the official merger of St. Teresa of Avila Parish into St. Thomas the Apostle Parish has taken place there are some changes that you might need to be aware of.

- Most importantly, the 10:00 Mass at St. Teresa will move to 11:00am starting in September.
- We will be merging the two parish websites into one. At some point, if you go to St. Teresa's website, you will be automatically redirected to St. Thomas' website. This will allow us to keep everything in one place.
- We will also be combining into one parish envelope system. As a result, your envelope number may change.
- We will also be combining our online giving into one program. Currently we have one program for St. Thomas, We Share, and one for St. Teresa, Vanco. Since there are very few people using Vanco, we will invite everyone to switch over to We Share.
- Many of these changes do not dramatically affect how things operate but help us at the office level to coordinate things better.

<u>BAPTISM CLASS</u>: As with every sacrament, we seek to prepare people for the sacrament they are receiving. Often our Religious Education, or Faith Formation, stops when we are confirmed, and there is a need to update adults in their faith. As a result, we require all first-time parents to attend a Baptism Class prior to having their child baptized. The best time to take this class is before the child is born and before godparents are chosen. Parents can call the parish office to set up a time to take this class.
