

Notes from the Pastor

FEAST OF ST. THOMAS: The feast of St. Thomas falls on Thursday, July 3. We will celebrate the feast at all the Masses on the weekend of July 5 and 6. We will do the same for the Feast of St. Teresa in October.

SUMMER CONSTRUCTION: Just like Pennsylvania roads, maintenance will be a part of our parishes for the coming months. We ask you to be patient and understanding when there is a roof being replaced or a parking lot being paved.

At St. Teresa we will be replacing the roof on the church in late summer or early fall. The parking lot will be sealed at some point as well. These projects are projected to cost us \$80,000. The roof will be paid for from the sale of Our Lady of Fatima and the parking lot will be paid for by this year's CSA appeal.

At St. Thomas we have just completed another section of the roof and have two more roofs to go to complete the church: the flat roof over the St. Elizabeth Room and the steeple roof. These were part of a project we started two years ago and will be completed this summer. Also, the parking lots at St. Thomas will be re-surfaced by a company that is doing road work in Corry, Suit-Kote. This will be a three-part process which will entail the parking lot being closed from time to time. The office will remain open during this time, but you may not be able to park in the parking lot. The roofing project will end up costing over \$200,000 taken from a bequest made to the parish and the parking lot will be an additional \$60,000. The parking lot will be paid for out of funds raised over the past two years in the CSA appeal.

We have been addressing some of the physical needs of the two churches over the past two years and we still have several significant projects yet to do at each church. A new roof is needed at St. Teresa Parish center, boilers at St. Thomas Church, School, and office need to be replaced.

I thank you for your generosity to our parish in order to make these needed improvements possible. The future of our parish and its churches depends on you. Thank You for being so supportive of what we are doing.

UPCOMING EVENTS: ANOINTING OF THE SICK: After all the Masses this weekend, we will celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Immediately after Mass, we ask all those who wish to be anointed to sit in the VERY FIRST ROW to facilitate the anointing.

Who is eligible to receive the sacrament?

- A person who becomes ill and the illness becomes more serious;
- A person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery;
- Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present;
- Sick children are to be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. In case of doubt whether a child has reached the use of reason, the sacrament is to be conferred;
- Some types of mental illness are now classified as serious. Those who are judged to have a serious mental illness and who would be strengthened by the sacrament may be anointed (depression, paranoia, etc...).
- In case of doubt as to whether the illness is serious or not, the person should be anointed.

You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. (Matthew 16:16)

HOW TO RECEIVE COMMUNION: I have posted this several times and people are either not reading it or ignoring it.

First of all, if you choose to receive the Precious Blood from one of the cups, you are to take the cup in your hands and drink from the cup. Typically, people take a small sip. IT IS NEVER PERMITTED TO TAKE THE HOST AND DIP THE HOST INTO THE WINE. The minister of the Eucharist should cover the cup and instruct you to please consume the host first and then consume the wine.

If you choose to receive communion on the tongue, you should lean your head back open your mouth wide and extend your tongue. The minister of the Eucharist will place the host on your tongue. You should not try to bite the host out of the hand of the minister of the Eucharist. The host is placed on your tongue.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem in the fourth century offered a beautiful and powerful catechesis on the mode of receiving communion in the hand that is still applicable today: "When you approach, do not go stretching out your open hands or having your fingers spread out, but make the left hand into a throne for the right which shall receive the King, and then holding in your open hand the Body of Christ, reciting the 'Amen.'

If you choose to receive communion in the hand, the minister of the Eucharist will say "the Body of Christ," and you will respond by saying, "Amen." If you are right-handed, then your left hand should be extended to be flat and your right hand should be underneath your left hand. The host will be placed in the palm of your hand. You

should take the host with your right hand and place it in your mouth. (The opposite is true if you are left-handed.)

- Please do not grab the host from the minister of the Eucharist.
- Allow the minister of the Eucharist to place the host in your hand and wait until the minister's hand is out of the way before you reach to take the host in your hand to consume it. You should not be reaching for the host until AFTER the minister has placed the host in your hand.
 - Please make sure your hand is flat, not cupped.
- You should not be flipping the host from one hand to another and then picking it up to consume it. Your dominant hand should be on the bottom.
- Please make sure that one hand is underneath the other, not side by side.
- We do not eat the host out of the palm of our hand, but we pick up the host and place it in our mouth.
- PLEASE do not switch lines to receive from the priest or deacon. The Eucharist you receive from a priest, deacon, or lay minister is the real presence of Christ that is what we do in each celebration of the Eucharist. There are not some hosts that are better than others. Switching lines is insulting to the Eucharistic Minister.
